 BD Live: Nando's says Mugabe advert fake... HARARE, ZIMBABWE: An advert for fast-food chain Nando's using the now instantly recognisable image of Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe falling is a fake, the company said on Thursday.

The fall prompted a number of postings showing the Zimbabwean president surfing, fleeing riot police and riding a horse, to name but three.

The chain, reports *BD Live* issued a statement: "Nando's Zimbabwe would like to assure the people of Zimbabwe that

this advertisement was neither created nor sanctioned by Nando's," the chain said in an advert published in Zimbabwe's state-run government mouthpiece, the *Herald* newspaper.
